BRIEF SUMMARY

Main Characteristics of the Vineyards

Located in the Andes Mountains between 1.720 – 2.206 m.a.s.l. in Alcohuaz, Elqui Valley, Chile. This is an area of great luminosity and clean blue skies.

Characteristics of the Vintage

<u>Winter-Spring 2010:</u> annual rainfall was 53,5 mm. (below average).

RHU-2011

There were no snowfalls or frosts in the vineyards.

<u>Summer 2011:</u> the summer was dry, with only 0,5 mm. of rain.

Average maximum summer temperature for the warmest month (January) was 28°C, and the average minimum was 11,4°C. It was a normal year.
